


Registration Deadline

Deadline for registration in the St. John Vianney Summer Program is June 7, 2024. Early registration is highly recommended as courses fill quickly.

Registration is done on a first-come, first-served basis. St. John Vianney School reserves the right to cancel or modify a course if there is insufficient enrollment. Confirmation of a student's enrollment will be emailed after the application has been received.

Pick-Up/Drop Off

Parents are asked to follow the cones set up for morning drop off/pick-up. Enter through the church driveway and exit at the parish hall driveway. Our "one lane" drive-thru is set up to flow continuously. When dropping off/picking up your child, please continue to the end of the cones before stopping. Students will go directly to their assigned classroom upon drop off. Your child will be directed to your car following dismissal.

Student Safety

Adult supervision will be provided between the hours of 7:45-8:00am and 11:30-11:45am. Students should not arrive on campus any earlier, unless enrolled in Before School Care. Only those students registered in Before or After School Care will be admitted into the program. Loitering on campus will not be permitted. St. John Vianney School will not accept responsibility for unattended children before or after their scheduled classes.

CATALOG OF CLASSES

<u>Early Learning Center – 3&4 Year Olds</u> 8:00 – 11:30AM (<u>Must be 3 years old by September 30</u>) Ms. Allison Lum

This introductory class gives our littlest youngsters an opportunity to acclimate themselves with the exciting adventure of learning in a school setting! They will learn through play, practice following directions, and acquire important social skills while working in a group environment. This session will help prepare them for their preschool (ELC3) pre-kindergarten (ELC4) year. Keiki <u>must</u> be potty-trained! Students must be enrolled in our Early Learning Center for the 2024-2025 school year.

8:00 - 11:30AM

<u>Keikigarten</u> (<u>Must be 5 years old by September 30</u>) Mrs. Allison Lee

Designed for the student entering kindergarten, this program will help familiarize your child with life at St. John Vianney School. Children will learn to write their name using the upper and lower case letters and will be introduced to the Spalding phonics program. Math, art, and pre-reading skills will also be incorporated into the daily program.

Fabulous First & Second Grades8:00 - 11:30AMMrs. Kailee Alexander

Students entering first and second grade will focus on building essential skills necessary for success in reading, writing, and math for the coming school year. In addition to academic enrichment, students will have the opportunity to unleash their creativity through various hands-on art activities.

<u>Amazing Adventures for Grades 3 & 4</u> 8:00 - 11:30AM Ms. Karli-Jo Carlton Ms. Gina Carnazzo

Each day we will focus on three subject areas. The rising third and fourth graders will spend one hour of the day building their grammar, reading, and comprehension skills. They will spend another hour strengthening their understanding of multiplication, division, fractions, decimals, measurements, data, and geometry. We will also spend some time reviewing previously learned concepts to better prepare them for the new year. Finally, the students will expand their 'ike Hawai'i or Hawaiian knowledge. Together we will develop a better understanding of the islands they call home through the Hawaiian language and a variety of cultural activities.

Grades 5-8 Masterminds

8:00-11:30AM

Students entering grades five through eight will focus on mastering multiplication, division, fractions, and other math concepts. They will study the book, *Seedfolks* by Paul Fleischman, while strengthening their grammar and language skills. During the third period of the morning students will explore the world through the camera's eye, creating photographic works of art.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- **Refunds:** If a student withdraws before the program starts, 75% of the fee will be refunded. No refunds will be given once school begins.
- What to Bring: Students should bring a notebook and pen/pencil on the first day of school. They will be notified in each class what supplies will be needed. Students remaining on campus for After School Care must bring their own lunch and drink. Lunches should not require refrigeration or heating.
- **What to Wear:** Casual attire is acceptable, but if dress is deemed inappropriate, the parent will be contacted. <u>Shoes or sandals with a back strap are required.</u>
- What to Eat:Children are encouraged to bring a light snack for break
time. Soda, candy and gum are not acceptable for snack.

- Absences: If your child will be absent, please call the school office before 8:00am.

Tardiness: Students who are late must come to the office for a late slip before going to class.
Behavior: We expect good behavior from any student enrolled in our summer school. Parents will be contacted if there a problem develops. Disciplinary problems may result in the student's dismissal from our program without refund.
Visitors: Visitors are not allowed on campus while Summer School is in session.
Report Cards: Summer school progress reports will be sent home with the students on the last day of class.
